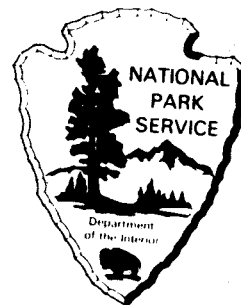

## YELLOWSTONE AWARDED DEPARTMENT OF ENERGY GRANT

Thanks to the dedicated efforts and hard work of Yellowstone's Facility Manager Mike Montgomery and of the Maintenance Division, the Energy Department's Federal Energy Efficiency Fund has awarded Yellowstone National Park \$455,655 (to date) to update energy inefficient facilities and equipment. The project will involve insulating walls and ceilings, installing new lighting, improving windows, installation of insulated overhead doors, and the improvement and upgrading of existing heating systems in five developed areas of the park, including Mammoth, Canyon, Lake, Lamar Valley, and Madison. Over a life cycle of 20 years, these projects may save well over 100 billion BTU's in energy, a savings of 62% over current energy consumption. The grant will allow the park to reduce its annual energy consumption over \$600,000 in the same 20-year life cycle.

Energy saving projects have already started at Canyon. Facilities in the maintenance area and visitor center have been completely insulated. Next, the crews will begin work at the Lake and Madison maintenance areas. Improvements in the Mammoth area will be an on-going project involving the heating plants serving the old garage, the Center for Resources, and the administration building.
