Resource Management Workshop Begins

The Ninth Annual Resource Management Workshop will be held February 7-9, 1995, at the YCC camp. This year's theme for the workshop is **Yellowstone's Cultural Resources**. The guest speaker list includes, former Park Historian Aubrey Haines, Regional Ethnographer Dave Rupert, Archeologist Ann Johnson, Historical Architect Jim McDonald, and as the keynote dinner speaker, the RMR's new Regional Director John Cook.

Session topics will include Historical Overview of Yellowstone, Early Developments: Hotels, Tent Camps, Lodges, and Tourist Cabins, Historic Architecture, History of Transportation, Introduction to Cultural Compliance, Preserving the Museum Collection, Yellowstone's Prehistoric and Historic Archeology, and topics such as grizzly bears, bison, wolves, lake trout, winter use and wetlands will also be discussed. The purpose of this workshop is to enhance the understanding of park resources, to share and update information, refine field techniques, and discuss future resource management direction in the park. All employees are welcome to attend any of the sessions. Susan Kraft, Park Curator, will sign employees up for informative museum and archive orientation sessions. News from the Safety Office....

The Hazard Communication program requires chemical manufacturer's to develop a material safety data sheet (MSDS) for each substance they produce or import. By law, your employer must have this material for every chemical and hazardous product in your workplace and make sure they are readily accessible to you. The material safety data sheet covers:

1. Identity of chemical and manufacturer
2. Hazardous ingredients
3. Physical and chemical characteristics
4. Physical Hazards
5. Reactivity
6. Health Hazards
7. Precautions for safe handling and use
8. Control measures

The Loss Control office has access to a computer program with many different MSDS sheets on hand. If your department is in need of this type of information, please contact Galen Warren at 344-2029 and he will be glad to help you update your files.
